

READ BEFORE REMOVING MIRROR(S) FROM BACKING SHEET: When removing mirror(s) from backing sheet, start by carefully peeling the sheet away from the mirror(s) at all four corners. **SLOWLY** remove mirror(s) from backing sheet, being careful **NOT** to pull too quickly from either end as this might result in the mirror snapping in two.

1. Start with a clean, dry, dust-free surface.

Recommended surfaces:

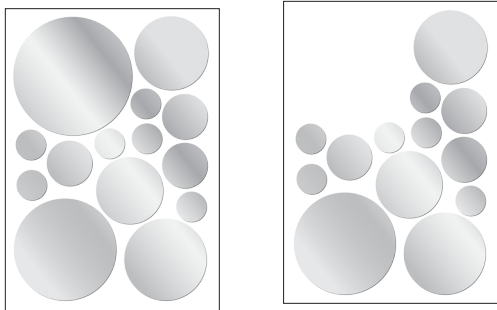
- Smooth, dry, clean, dust-free, non-textured primed, painted surfaces

If in doubt, try it on an inconspicuous spot.

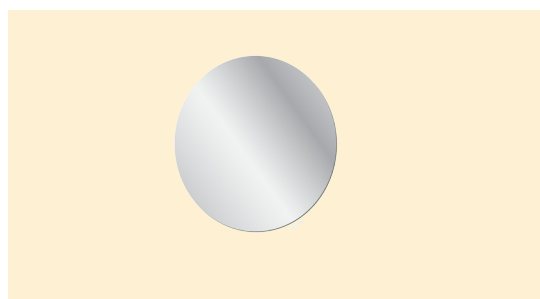
May not be suitable for:

- Recently painted walls. Newly painted walls need to cure for at least 30 days
- Composite board, veneer, laminate or paper surfaces
- Textured walls or wallpaper
- Unpainted brick, cement or cinder block
- Outdoor surfaces
- Any porous, uneven or rough surface

2. Remove mirror from the backing sheet.



3. Place on desired surface. Gently rub mirror to assure adhesive makes contact with the surface.



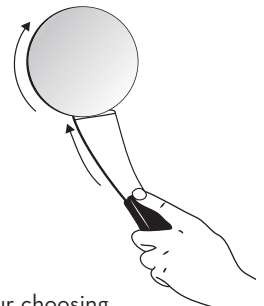
4. Mirrors can be wiped clean with a damp cloth. Do not use cleaning products of any kind

Removal Directions for Adhesive Acrylic Mirrors:

The best way to remove our adhesive acrylic mirrors from your wall without breaking is to use a common household, thin flexible metal putty knife. This works especially well with our mirror words which have connection points between letters where the acrylic material is narrow and easily broken.

Follow the below steps for best success....

1. Take the flexible metal putty knife and find a starting point underneath the mirror being thoughtful not to dig the knife into the wall.
2. Gently and carefully begin to move the knife under the mirror around it's entire outside edge.
3. As you slowly move the knife under and around the mirror's entire outside edge it will come away from the wall in one piece. The more of the knife you can get under the mirror the better. You can use your fingers now to carefully lift the mirror away from the wall taking care not to bend the mirror causing it to break or snap.
4. Once removed, you can either return the mirror to the original release paper or apply the mirror to another location of your choosing. Understand that each time you remove a mirror from the wall, the adhesive side will pick up dust and debris and over time and after reapplications, they begin to lose their adhesive effectiveness. This is why it is very important to clean and dry the wall area you've chosen before application.
